



Forord / Foreword

Siden 1883 har samtidens dagsordensættende kunstnere indtaget Kunsthall Charlottenborg. Her kunne de besøgende opleve de nye talenter, se ind i fremtiden og møde verdensstjernerne. Og sådan er det stadig!

I 2017 viser vi nye talenter på både Forårsudstillingen og Kunstakademiet Afgangsdudstilling. Internationale stjerner som Hito Steyerl, Tori Wrånes og Ahmet Ögüt har alle soloudstillinge. CPH:DOX omdanner Charlottenborg til internationalt filmfestival-palæ med biografer, udstillinger, virtual reality, koncerter med mere. Over sommeren viser vi den hidtil største udstilling af John Kørner ved siden af en kontroversiel international gruppeudstilling om whistleblowers. Og endelig præsenterer vi for første gang et samlet overblik over den unikke kunstner Ovartaci uden for det psykiatriske hospital i Risskov, hvor han var patient i 56 år.

Det seneste år har været godt for Kunsthall Charlottenborg. Besøgstallet steg, og det samme gjorde antallet af ambitiøse udstillinger og events. Det er dejligt, at kunsthallen lever, og vi kan udfolde samtidskunstens potentiale til et voksende publikum. 

Den skelsættende videoinstallation *Factory of the Sun* af den tyske stjerne-kunstner Hito Steyerl er en medrivende totaloplevelse, der beskæftiger sig med samtidens konstante billedstrøm og avancerede billedteknologi. Temaer som overvågning, computerspil, globalisering, moderne krigsførelse og antikapitalistiske bevægelser flettes elegant sammen i en fængslende fortælling, hvor grænserne mellem virkelighed og fiktion udviskes.

The ground-breaking video installation *Factory of the Sun* by German star artist Hito Steyerl is an engrossing and immersive experience that addresses the constant flow of images and advanced image technology of our present day. Charlottenborg Forårsudstilling er én af de vigtigste åbne, censurerede udstillinger i Europa og har siden 1857 været en del af Kunsthall Charlottenborgs årsprogram. Udstillingen byder traditionen tro på et særligt udvalg af værker indenfor fagområderne kunst, arkitektur og design.

Charlottenborg Forårsudstilling 2017 modtog 781 ansøgninger, hvoraf 61 kunstnere fra hele verden står bag de 107 værker, der i år udstilles. Udstillingen byder på kunstneriske bidrag af etablerede kunstnere, men også spirende talenter fra både Danmark og Europa samt lande som USA og Japan.




The Charlottenborg Spring Exhibition 2017 this year received 781 applications. The successful applicants number 61 artists from around the world, who have created the 107 works on display this year. The exhibition presents contributions from well-established artists, but also works by emerging talents from Denmark, Europe, the USA and Japan.

Welcome Too Late

18 Mar – 28 Maj

Når alt lige fra klima til teknologi forandrer sig med stadig større hast, bliver det sværere at følge med tiden. Fremtiden bliver hurtigere til nutid og nutiden hurtigere til fortid. Kunstnere og dokumentarister oplever, at de kommer for sent til den samtid, de vil indfange.

I stedet for at løbe efter tiden i et forsøg på at zoome ind på nu'et, er der nu tendens til at zoome ud på andre større tidsligheder. Dette er præmisen for gruppeudstillingen *Welcome Too Late* i lyset af forandringer som eksplosiv befolkningstilvækst, stigende temperaturer og vandstande, automatisering, kunstig intelligens, voksende ulighed, udsigt til evigt liv, genoplivelse af dyrearter og masseudslettelse.

Udstillingen præsenterer bl.a. skulptur, installation og film af unge kunstnere så som Iain Ball (1985, UK), Marguerite Humeau (1986, FR) og Katja Novitskova (1984, EE).

Welcome To Late præsenteres i samarbejde med dokumentarfilmfestivalen CPH:DOX, der i perioden 16.-26. april omdanner Kunsthall Charlottenborg til internationalt festivalpalæ med både udstillinger, biografer, debatter, branche-forum og virtual reality-biograf.

When everything from the climate to the realm of technology changes with increasing rapidity, keeping up becomes ever more difficult. The future becomes the present and the present becomes the past with growing speed. Artists and documentarians find themselves arriving too late to capture the contemporary age they wish to portray.

Instead of chasing time in an attempt at zooming in on the here and now, there is a growing tendency towards zooming out onto other, wider temporalities. This is the fundamental premise of the group exhibition *Welcome Too Late*, which focuses on changes such as explosive population growth, rising temperatures and sea levels, automation, artificial intelligence, growing inequality, the prospect of eternal life, the resurrection of extinct species and mass annihilation.

The exhibition presents a range of works, including sculpture, installation art, and films by young artists such as Iain Ball (1985, UK), Marguerite Humeau (1986, FR) and Katja Novitskova (1984, EE).

Welcome Too Late is presented in collaboration with the documentary film festival CPH:DOX, which turns Kunsthall Charlottenborg into a festival mansion with exhibitions, movie theaters, debates, industry forum and virtual reality cinema during the period March 16-26.



JOHN KØRNER

18 Jun – 13 Aug

I året hvor John Kørner fylder 50 år, præsenterer Kunsthall Charlottenborg den største udstilling af hans værk til dato. Med et særligt fokus på de samfundsproblematikker, som kunstneren gennem årene har arbejdet med, retter den over 1000 m² store, retrospektive udstilling blikket mod Kørner som en væsentlig fornyer af samtidsmaleriet.

Udstillingen sætter spot på Kørners unikke evne til at formulere sig ud over lærredets grænser i rumlige installationer og på hans tilgang til kunsten som et sted, hvor skønhed såvel som socialt engagement kan komme til udtryk.

Kørner vil til udstillingen skabe en serie nye malerier samt stedsspecifikke og rumlige totalinstallationer.

Ud over de nye, omfattende installationer vil udstillingen for første gang samle en række af Kørners væsentligste maleriserier, bl.a. hans tidlige *Problem-billeder*, samt *Outdoor Struggling*, *Kvinder til salg* og *War Problems*. Udstillingen bliver således en hidtil uset mulighed for at opleve kunstnerens hovedværker samlet.

In the year of John Kørner's fiftieth birthday, Kunsthall Charlottenborg will present the largest exhibition ever seen of his work. Spanning more than 1000 m² of floor space, this retrospective places particular emphasis on the social issues addressed by the artist over the years, investigating Kørner as an important reinventor of contemporary painting.

The show focuses on Kørner's unique ability to speak beyond the boundaries of the canvas in spatial installations, and on his approach to art as a space where beauty and social commitment can both find expression.

For this exhibition Kørner will create a series of new paintings as well as site-specific immersive installations.

In addition to the new, extensive installations, the exhibition will also bring together a range of Kørner's most important series of paintings for the first time ever. Among these *Problem-billeder*, *Outdoor Struggling*, *Kvinder til salg* and *War Problems*. Thus, the show will offer an unprecedented opportunity to see the artist's major works gathered under one roof.

Hvem ejer retten til at definere, om whistleblowers er samfundets helte eller fjender? Om der bag den digitale aktivisme står frihedskæmpere, der slås for sandhed og retfærdighed, eller terrorister, der truer statens sikkerhed?

Whistleblowers & Vigilantes er en kontroversiel udstilling, der gennem kunstværker, tv-klip, overvågning, dokumentarisme og historiske dokumenter præsenterer perspektiver på den intensive debat om whistleblowers.

Udstillingen viser de aktivistiske strategier og juridiske opfattelser, som whistleblowers, hackere, online aktivister og billedkunstnere bruger til at retfærdiggøre deres indsats i den digitale modstandskamp. Blandt de medvirkende er Anonymous, Julian Assange, DIS, Omer Fast, Chelsea Manning, Metahaven, Edward Snowden og Edward Snowden.

Who owns the right to define whether whistleblowers are society's heroes or enemies? Whether digital activism is carried out by freedom fighters who wage war for truth and justice, or by terrorists who threaten national security?

Whistleblowers & Vigilantes is a controversial exhibition that uses art, TV footage, surveillance, documentary approaches and historical documents to offer a range of perspectives on the fierce discussion concerning whistleblowers.

The exhibition showcases the activist strategies and legal positions that whistleblowers, hackers, online activists and artists use to justify their efforts in the digital rebellions – featuring Anonymous, Julian Assange, DIS, Omer Fast, Chelsea Manning, Metahaven, Edward Snowden and others.



TORI WRÅNES

16 Sep – 19 Nov, Fernisering / Opening 15 Sep

Den norske kunstner Tori Wrånes (f. 1978) skaber skulpturelle installationer og opsigtsvækkende performances. Hendes egen krop er i centrum, idet hun bruger sin stemme som kraftfuldt instrument og iklæder sig særprægede masker og kostumer, der deformerer hendes udseende og sammen med rekvisitter og andre medvirkende, er det alt sammen med til at skabe et forunderligt og drømmeagtigt univers. Det er Tori Wrånes' første soloudstilling i Danmark.

OVARTACI

16 Sep – 31 Dec, Fernisering / Opening 15 Sep

Med denne udstilling er det første gang, at et betydeligt overblik over den unikke kunstner Ovartacis livsværk præsenteres uden for det psykiatriske hospital i Risskov, hvor kunstneren i 56 år var patient. Udstillingen perspektiverer Ovartacis fantastiske univers ved at vise en række samtidskunstnere, som tematisk eller i kunstnerisk form afspejler Ovartacis kunst. Udstillingen udfolder dermed den galskab, det begær og ikke mindst de politiske perspektiver, som udspringer fra Ovartacis værker. Udstillingen arrangeres i samarbejde med Museum Ovartaci og kurateres af Mathias Kryger.

AHMET ÖGÜT

7 Dec 2017 – 18 Feb 2018, Fernisering / Opening 6 Dec

Kollektiv hukommelse, lokal historie og kulturel identitet er blandt de emner, som den kurdiske kunstner Ahmet Ögüt fra Tyrkiet beskæftiger sig med i sine opsigtsvækkende og ambitiøse projekter, der tager pulsen på vores samtid. Med kritisk sans og et glimt i øjet præsenterer Ögüt komplekse problemstiller i værker, der spænder fra skulptur og film over installation og performance til iscenesatte begivenheder, som publikum inviteres til at deltage i.

Norwegian artist Tori Wrånes (b. 1978) creates sculptural installations and striking performances. Her own body takes centre stage as she uses her voice as a powerful instrument and puts on strange masks and costumes that distort her appearance. Combined with props and fellow performers, the total effect is eerie, wonderful and dreamlike. This is Tori Wrånes' first solo exhibition in Denmark.

OVARTACI

16 Sep – 31 Dec, Fernisering / Opening 15 Sep

This exhibition for the first time ever presents a significant overview of the life's work created by the unique artist Ovartaci outside the psychiatric hospital in Risskov, where the artist was a patient for 56 years. The exhibition offers additional perspectives on Ovartaci's fantastical universe by showcasing a number of contemporary artists whose themes or formal modes of expression reflect Ovartaci's art. Thus, the exhibition unfolds the madness, the desire and – importantly – the political perspectives that emanate from Ovartaci's work. The exhibition is arranged in collaboration with Museum Ovartaci and curated by Mathias Kryger.

AHMET ÖGÜT

7 Dec 2017 – 18 Feb 2018, Fernisering / Opening 6 Dec

Collective memory, local history and cultural identity are among the subjects addressed by Ahmet Ögüt, a Kurdish artist from Turkey. His striking, ambitious projects take the measure of our contemporary society. With a keen, critical eye and tongue placed firmly in cheek, Ögüt presents complex issues in works that range from sculpture and film to installation and performance art and staged events that the audience is invited to take part in.
